Nature Calgary's Speaker Series

Wed Jan 17: Dale Leckie presents Rocks, Ridges, and Rivers: Geological Wonders of Banff, Yoho, and Jasper National Parks. Dale Leckie has a Ph.D. in Geology from McMaster University, a M.Sc. in Geography from McMaster University and B.Sc. in Geography from University of Alberta. Dale is a professional geologist who has worked as a scientist at the Geological Survey of Canada and as chief geologist in a large Canadian energy company.

Wed Feb 21: Dr Lu Carbyn presents Wolves in Wolf Clothes. Our speaker has many years of experience working with wolves around the world. Dr. Carbyn will draw on some of these experiences and he will explore the many fascinating aspects of the biology, management and conservation of this species. This promises to be an interesting evening, as he will challenge some often widely held modern myths about several controversial topics.

Wed Mar 21: Trekking Across Alberta Near the 49th Parallel - From Saskatchewan to BC. In May and June 2017, Gus Yaki, a life-long naturalist in his 85th year, led a trek across southern Alberta. The trip's purpose was to observe that area's unique flora and fauna, to show fellow travellers the rich diversity of species that live in the area, and to raise much-needed funds for conservation organizations.



Sat Jan 13, 9:30am: Snowy Owl Pre-Prowl. A precursor to Nature Calgary's popular Snowy Owl Prowl. We head east of Calgary to look for Snowy Owls, Snow Buntings, Horned Larks, Great Horned Owls, Falcons and others. Trip will go until approximately 3:30 - 4:00pm. Bring lunch. Will be a short break approximately halfway through the trip. Sat Mar 3, 6:45am: Magpie Dispersal at Weaselhead Natural Area. Watch hundreds of Magpies leave their roosts at sunrise (7:17am) to disperse across the city. Pelagic Trip: Sep 16 Registration has begun for Nature Alberta's first ever Pelagic Trip.
